IN 2022 WE CELEBRATED THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF AMG AND GOD'S INCREDIBLE FAITHFULNESS.

We are so grateful for what the Lord has done and continues to do through you as you partner with AMG to take the gospel to the ends of the earth to meet the deepest spiritual and physical needs of the lost and suffering. The Lord has been using you and others like you over the past 80 years to touch countless lives for Christ!



LAST YEAR, GOD opened doors to expand our ministries in Colombia, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Ghana, Nigeria, and the Philippines. You made it possible to meet the deepest needs in 40 countries in 2022.

Many areas we serve are returning to normalcy following the COVID-19 pandemic. Some countries, such as Guatemala, continue with certain restrictions. For example, school activities must be in small groups with rotating schedules. At the same time, inflation and rising food costs are a global problem. The nationals you support in Guatemala and elsewhere are addressing these needs and using innovative approaches to deal with the restrictions still in place. We're happy to report that your continued support is making it possible for AMG programs to thrive and make a difference in the lives of people all over the world.

Another area where you are making a difference is the outreach to refugees. Over the last few years, our nationals have been helping Burmese refugees from Myanmar who have fled the ongoing violence caused by the civil conflict in the aftermath of the military coup. Because of your incredible response to the needs in Myanmar in 2021 with your prayers and faithful giving and your continued support in 2022, God has done more than we could ever imagine. While working with refugees in this area, the need for shelter became apparent. Your support provided for the opening and subsequent expansion of the Light Asean Hostel as a safe home for the children of refugees. The hostel staff provides aid, shelter, nutritious meals, and education support.

When the war in Ukraine began, you enabled our national leaders to take quick action to assist those in need. Many people needed shelter and food, some in Ukraine and some who fled the country, especially women and children. Your generosity provided for over 500 deliveries across Ukraine and helped to distribute over 650 tons of food and supplies. Thank you for your partnership with us. You are being used by God to make an impact around the world. Together we press on to proclaim Christ's love and advance His kingdom. Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. OUR 4-MONTH TEACHING stint at By Grace School in the mountains of northern Thailand ended in the middle of October 2022. We decided to visit some of AMG's projects in other areas of Thailand.

One of AMG's child development centers is in Museekee, tucked away in a remote area about 100 miles northwest of the provincial capital of Chiang Mai. The Museekee project has served children, teenagers, and families from underprivileged backgrounds. We have helped to meet their spiritual, educational, and physical needs for over 30 years with many beautiful outcomes.

We were honored to speak to a group of Museekee community students. The high school graduates of the group received a gift and recognition for their achievements. Afterward, I was excited to meet an AMG-sponsored student in her final year and planning to be a teacher. Chonnikar spoke of her sponsor with admiration and love. She recognized that without this woman's support since her early childhood, she would never have been able to achieve what she had accomplished. I hoped to share Chonnikar's story with her sponsor, Susan Walton.

AMG's home office invited us to speak at the annual AMG banquet in Pennsylvania two weeks after we returned to Tennessee. It was a special 80th-anniversary event. When they handed us the program for the banquet, I was surprised to see that the pianist at the event was a woman named Susan Walton!





Susan had no idea whom I had met in Thailand three weeks before. She listened to the story of my unexpected meeting with Chonnikar as I related the incredible lifelong impact a sponsor can have on a child. God indeed orchestrated that meeting at that time. Susan and I later shared our stories about Chonnikar, her past successes, and her hopes for the future. We were incredibly blessed to see how God had first arranged my meeting with Chonnikar, then unexpectedly, to meet her sponsor who had made such a difference in Chonnikar's life.

Expanding God's Love

ALEKOS AND NAFSIKA Charalambidis served at AMG's CosmoVision Center in Athens, Greece, for 14 years. In 2011 they visited Tanzania, where they were overwhelmed by young children working demanding jobs and living in extreme poverty. For most of these children, particularly orphans, schooling was never an option. Moved by their experience, they prayed about the situation and felt led to move to Tanzania. In 2013 they moved to Galiljembe, a village outside of the city of Mbeya, and began building the Tanzania Orphans' Mission. They desired to build a safe environment for these precious orphans to learn and grow and be kids. The goal of TOM is to share Christ's love, support, educate and equip children in their adolescence so they can eventually return to their villages, be rooted in

their faith, and have the opportunity to break the cycle of poverty.

Just before the Covid pandemic, Alekos and Nafsika came to the conclusion that it was time for them to return to Greece. They prayerfully considered what the future steps for TOM needed to be and felt the Lord leading them to partner with AMG to continue the ministry, having seen the impact AMG's child and youth development ministry, carried out with the love of Jesus, had made in the lives of thousands of children around the world over the years. After prayerful consideration, AMG readily agreed to take on and continue this wonderful ministry.

God led the way through this transition providing the right individuals for this ministry to follow after Alekos and Nafsika. Two of these individuals were Christina and her daughter, Stefania.

Christina was raised in a Christian home in Greece and became a follower of Jesus herself. At a youth camp, she felt confirmation that her life's

purpose was to tell others that Jesus is alive. She came to the United States for Bible school, and God has been using her ever since. Over the years, she worked with several camps and churches and served as a missionary in Germany and Spain.

When Greece was flooded with unaccompanied refugee children and victims of war a few years back, with the desire to work with orphans, and her love for children, Christina returned to Greece to work with these refugees.

Knowing Christina's background and her passion for children, Alekos and Nafsika thought she might be a good fit during the transition period at TOM. During that time, Christina and Stefania both fell in love with children at TOM and prayerfully decided to remain at TOM to serve for an extended period of time. God is using them to grow the ministry of TOM and show the love of Christ to these children.

The orphanage currently has 91 children. The property has six dorms, classrooms, a kitchen and dining hall, and housing for the teaching staff and volunteers. It also includes facilities to raise animals and process rice and corn flour to make the facility more self-sustainable. TOM also has camp facilities 90 miles away, on the shores of Lake Malawi. They travel here twice a year, and the kids enjoy swimming, hiking, games, activities, and Bible lessons.

The ministry of TOM is giving us the opportunity to grow our engagement in the community and build relationships with even more people. Local churches are growing, and we can provide the pastors with much-needed biblical training. Pray that God will continue to bless this ministry, raise national leaders to grow it, and many more lives will be impacted with the love of Christ as donors like you make it possible to meet their deepest needs.





Hope Through Suffering



UKRAINE

WITH THE RECENT attacks on civilian infrastructure including power generating stations, Ukraine is on the brink of a complete blackout adding further hardship to its people's daily struggles. More than seven million have already fled Ukraine over the last year becoming refugees. Women and children ran from the country for safety while the men stayed behind to defend it. For the ones still living in Ukraine, it has been over a year of living in a warzone, feeling exhausted, grieving, and doing all they can to provide the basics for themselves and their loved ones. Jobs for them are limited, and it is difficult to afford basic supplies needed to survive. All normalcy and comfort have been ripped away from these hurting people. The Ukrainians are resilient, but the ongoing attacks on civilian targets have left them traumatized, with little hope or security for their future.

Ivanna is a testament to being a resilient Ukrainian. She is a 70-year-old woman living in a village overtaken by Russian troops, who ransacked her home and took her food, firewood, and even her animals. Then a rocket hit her 90-year-old neighbor's home. Ivanna ran to help her dear friend escape the burning house trying to pull her out the front window, but the Russians opened fire and hit Ivanna's arm, making it challenging to assist her desperate neighbor. Another neighbor came to help, and

together they rescued Ivanna's friend. They ran back to Ivanna's house and fearfully hid in her cellar for days, Ivanna with a gunshot wound that continued to bleed and in need medical attention.

The Ukrainian army pushed the Russian troops out of this small community. However, the people were left with nothing. It took our coworkers numerous trips to bring enough food to help this community. They also arranged medical help for those wounded and began to build relationships knowing these fellow Ukrainians were traumatized and needed healing.

In a nearby village, the Russian army abducted and tortured a pastor. After he was released, he returned to his church. Many thought he would flee to save his life and hide somewhere more safe, but he knew he needed to stay and be there for those seeking refuge and in need of hearing God's Word. His church was filled with 350 people, not his regular attendees. These individuals wanted to hear about God and listened while he shared the love of Christ. They listened to someone who had just gone through something so terrible, but who remained faithful and stayed in the church to preach the gospel and care for the people.

In a different village directly on the front lines of the fiercest fighting, another church has 20 devoted regular attendees who live in the area and meet at the church. Each week they have had around 200 other people show up for church services hungry for God's Word. Their weekly Bible study is still meeting and now consistently has approximately 100 people in attendance.

God is moving in the midst of suffering, and His people are sharing His Word amid a terrible war. There is tragedy all around, but this core of precious believers remain faithful to the call of Christ sharing the gospel with their fellow hurting, hopeless Ukrainians, showing them the love of Christ while teaching them that He is our hope. As the storm rages on, God gives them peace.

Because of your great response to quickly respond to the urgent needs in Ukraine, it has been amazing to come alongside the local churches and see them continue to serve and care for the deepest needs of others in the community.





Planted in Christ

AFTER SPENDING SEVEN long years in prayer, Victor, an AMG national leader who pastors in Indonesia, praises God for His provision to allow Victor's congregation to purchase the land they needed to build a church. The construction expenses are significant, but Victor's faith is much bigger. He is confident that God will also provide for those expenses and bless his church members through this process. As Victor ministers to his community, he witnesses God doing miracles often, and he knows God will also guide their building progress.

INDONESIA

With inflation, the community has struggled to meet its basic needs. A majority of his congregation are farmers who earn little income. But Victor is grateful that even in difficult circumstances, God provides peace and comfort. He is amazed by God's work in his community and rejoices in sharing stories to show how the Lord has been at work.

Someone in the community had asked Victor to visit a woman who had been in the hospital, unable to walk for six months. The first time he met Vera, she lay there helpless. Victor prayed with her and continued to visit her, frequently sharing about Jesus. After his third visit, he could not believe his eyes and immediately praised God because Vera was starting to walk! But the most amazing thing is that Vera, along with physical healing, has found spiritual healing. She has accepted Christ and is praying that her mother and brother will come to know the Lord. Another testimony of God's goodness that Victor shared was about a young Muslim mother of two young children. Her three-year-old boy, Raka, had a high fever and was having seizures. In this region, it is common to have spirit healers from local tribes come and perform healing rituals. After failed attempts to heal Raka with these rituals, his mother came to Victor and asked him to pray for her little boy.

Victor prayed with Raka's mother several times, and she noticed an improvement in his health. They would all pray together, and Victor would share the gospel while he was there. Siti, Raka's mother, began to open her heart to the gospel and was sure this was God healing her son in the name of Jesus. She began to pray for herself and her family. Siti asked Victor for Christian reading material and has been doing devotionals for months. She has come to know Jesus as her Lord and Savior. She praises God for healing her son, and Siti prays for her husband, who is still Muslim. She is confident that God hears her prayers and that her husband will come to know Jesus as his Savior.

God is moving in Indonesia through faithful national pastors planting churches in areas that deeply need the gospel. Pray for Victor and his congregation as they seek to move forward with the construction on their new church building. Pray that this entire community will be redeemed and radically transformed by the love and gospel of Jesus Christ.









The Center of Cultivation

AFTER RELOCATING TO a nearby community in the Philippines, John Elee's mother was eager to find a home church for her family. Reflecting on that time, John shares, "God is truly great. He knew exactly what my mother was looking for. A church to grow us intellectually and spiritually. And this is when AMG became part of our journey."

Their new church building was utilized as a school during the week. John's family learned this was an AMG child development center, and he began elementary school there to get a basic education. His family did not know yet the impact this center would have on John's life. After attending this school for almost two years, John received the news that someone had chosen to sponsor him, making all the services offered by the program available to him. Even as a young child, John knew God was taking care of him. John excelled in his studies with the help of his AMG tutor. He enjoyed playing sports, attending camps, and vacation Bible school.

When John was heading into high school, he began to experience troubles in life but also rested in the truth that God was still in control. His father became abusive to his mother, and she worried for their children's safety, so she decided to leave. In this challenging time, their family can testify that God was present in the storm and led them through it. John began attending Bible studies and leadership training, equipping him to become a youth leader in his church and continued to excel in his academic studies. John said, "Despite the hard things that happened, I did well in my studies, was an honor student, and graduated as valedictorian. Glory to God."

God continued to open doors for John. Because of his family's limited finances, John was unsure if he would be able to pursue a college education. However, he was awarded a scholarship allowing him to attend a private university for his Bachelor of Science in Accountancy. AMG's child development center reached out to him with a job offer to tutor at the center, providing some

income for him. He commuted to the center for his tutoring sessions in the evenings after his classes were over. Working with the students brought John much joy, and he felt blessed to be the tutor now.

John had to take an exam with seven subjects to complete his degree. The AMG center offered John a place to stay that was more convenient for him and allowed him to have a quiet space to study. He enjoys staying at the center. The staff always made him feel loved and treated him as their son.

After months of studying, John took the exam. He did not pass and had to retake two subjects, to his disappointment. John returned to the AMG center so he could study peacefully. After months of studying, he retook the exam and passed. John was overwhelmed in this triumphant moment, and all he could say was, "How great is our God."

John is now a certified public accountant employed by a real estate company in the Philippines. He is also a leader of young professionals and serves as a preacher. He is thankful that he can financially support his family, and he sponsors a child through AMG, giving another young person an opportunity like the one he was given. His prayer is that God will use AMG to impact this child's life and that they will experience the love of Christ as he did throughout his youth while at the center.

In 2022 John was elected as a board member of AMG Philippines. God used an AMG sponsor across the world to change his life, and John is eager to continue his involvement with AMG and give back to the program to impact others with the love of Jesus.

Seeing God's Word

WHAT MAKES AMG'S ministries possible in 40 countries around the world are the very special, faithful national leaders that will go to any length to share the Good News and the love of Christ. One of those extraordinary leaders is Pastor Rene in Bolivia.

Pastor Rene and three other pastors traveled from Santa Cruz to the region around the remote town of Cobija in Bolivia to reach people with the gospel. It was a long and difficult trip. To get to their destination, they flew for two hours by plane, rode a bus for six hours, and then a motorcycle for the last 62 miles.

They distributed 50 Bibles and 35 pairs of reading glasses during their trip. Those who received reading glasses have not been able to read for several years due to the lack of glasses. They were excited to put on the glasses and clearly see God's Word. During their travels, Pastor Rene and the other pastors took the gospel to eleven villages and three indigenous communities. Thriving After Treatment

MANY CHILDREN AROUND the world have manageable health complications that become life-threatening due to poverty and lack of resources. We recently spoke with a teenage girl, Miremba*, an orphan from Africa who lives with her grandmother. Her parents and two out of her five siblings have passed away from AIDS.

This young lady was born with HIV. While her grandmother does her best to meet the basic needs of her grandchildren, it is a struggle to provide for them. Doctors told Miremba's family that, in addition to taking prescribed antiviral medicines, she had to eat nutritious foods to help her stay healthy as her body battled HIV. Unfortunately, her grandmother could barely afford enough food for the family to survive, and her health suffered. The children did not attend school because they could not pay the fees. Miremba says it was hard watching all the other kids walking to school while she stayed home, doing nothing. Miremba chose not to play outside often because other children would make fun of her for looking sickly.

But things changed when a loving sponsor made it possible to care for Miremba. "I thank God for the loving family that extended their love to me

by sponsoring me through AMG," says Miremba. Through her sponsorship, Miremba received the medical attention she so deeply needed, and now she is able to live a normal life. AMG's medical facility provides antiviral HIV treatments that work so well that you would not know by looking at Miremba that she has HIV. The program also provides her with supplements and food. She is thriving and healthy.

Miremba is now in school and says that when she misses school, or the students are off for holidays, teachers will visit her with words of encouragement and pray with her. She shares, "Thanks to AMG, I know God loves me, and I have accepted Jesus as my personal Savior, and my trust is in Jesus Christ. He has done miracles in my life." The child and youth development center, which cares for Miremba has Bible studies on Saturdays, where the kids study and sing songs together. She says she hardly ever misses church on Sundays and loves hearing the Word of God. Her favorite verse is John 3:16 because of the promise that she will not perish but have eternal life.

Inspired by how AMG met her medical needs, Miremba has felt led to give back to the program and help other children she can relate to who are desperate for medical care. She dreams of becoming a doctor and one day treating patients through AMG's medical ministry.

Faith Takes Root

ONE OF THE most powerful tools our national leaders around the world are using to reach the unreached with the gospel is media. This includes gospel advertisements in newspapers and magazines, on social media and the internet, distributing copies of the Scriptures and other printed material, and radio broadcasts. These ads, printed material, and messages enter homes in Muslim, Buddhist, and Hindu communities which otherwise would not be reached with the Good News.

Indonesia is the country with the largest Muslim population in the world, and one of our national leaders ministers to prisoners there. We offer Bible courses to the inmates, and one, named Hendro, recently shared with us that the Bible course has incredibly blessed him. Through the Bible course, Hendro came to know the Lord and committed his life to Jesus. He was sentenced to 11 years in prison and said he knew he had made a mistake. "This is a time of punishment," he said, but he rejoices because he has begun a new life with God.

Another wonderful testimony from our media evangelism efforts in 2022 is that of a young man named Hosea from Indonesia. He heard one of our broadcasts on the radio. Along with his family, he began to listen weekly. Hosea became so interested in learning God's Word that he enrolled in AMG's Berita Hidup Seminary and is now in his second semester.

Praise God for all he is doing through media outlets to reach people in areas that can be challenging to share the gospel. Our goal is to disciple those who respond through Bible correspondence courses, connecting them to local pastors and communities of believers that will mentor them and help them on their spiritual journey to growing closer with God.

WITH 80 YEARS' worth of church relationships and organizational partners around the world, AMG is able to respond to many crises in the 40 countries where we work. Our team reacted swiftly to pull together our network and partners in Eastern Europe in response to the war in Ukraine. Together with our partners, we served thousands of Ukrainian refugees throughout the region, providing temporary shelter, hot meals, assistance with relocation, delivering tons of food and supplies and sharing the love of Christ.

Brian Dennett, our President of Engagement, continues to work to strengthen our existing partnerships and find new ones that can multiply the efforts of our work. One beautiful example is a partner that helped to fund the expansion of our powerful Bible club program in Western Africa, which will reach more than 80,000 children in the next few years. Public school students in Ghana, Togo, and Nigeria will learn God's Word, form relationships with Godly mentors, and be invited to join a local church in their community. Another example was the combined efforts of AMG and FCA, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, to do sports camps and leadership training in Central America.
